Eligibility & Guidelines

The Columbia Foundation is a public foundation that supports organizations and agencies that contribute to the quality of life in Howard County, specifically:

- Organizations with 501(c)(3) tax status that deliver services to Howard County residents in the areas of human services, the arts, education or community affairs.
- Each grantee is required to comply with the terms and conditions of the award and to provide an evaluation of the outcome of the funding.
- Members of the Board of Trustees make site visits to organizations that request funding and to those that are grant recipients.
- Renewed funding depends upon a reapplication and evaluation process.
- Organizations may receive a project or operational grant within a calendar year, but not both.
- Depending on circumstances, a second grant could be given if contingency grant requirements are met.
- We are particularly interested in proposals that demonstrate practical solutions and efforts at prevention, collaboration and volunteer support.
- The Columbia Foundation does not fund religious or sectarian activities, medical research or requests from individuals.

Types of Grants

Project grants encourage and support the development of innovative programs, services or events.

Operational grants are sustaining funds to organizations that have been in existence for at least three years, have received at least one Foundation grant within that time, and have received favorable evaluations.

Contingency grants are available year-round and are intended to alleviate unanticipated situations or crises. Applicants must consult with the Foundation's President prior to completing an application.
